No EMS Regulation


27 refugees to 100 nationals

- Special access response (rope rescue)
- Major incident response




- July 2006 Israel War

- 38 explosions and multiple casualty incidents since 2005




We still cannot respond to around 20% of calls due to lack of funding


Response Time Night

Cumulative Distribution Frequency of Response Time -- NIGHT (6pm - 6am)




Response Time Day






Objective 2023: 50,000 persons/year




EMS FUNDING OVERVIEW
